
Press Kit: FHEASY

Q&A IDEAS

1. How do you build family time into your daily and weekly routine?

I make sure our family has breakfast and dinner together and then I include our family home evening and scripture time with our meals; scriptures during breakfast and home evening once a week during dinnertime. On the weekends, we often do work projects and have a play night.

2. WHY ARE MEALTIMES IMPORTANT?

Dallin H. Oaks shared a study in General Conference that concluded that the time children spend eating meals at home is the greatest predictor of academic achievement and psychological adjustment.

3. What tips do you have to make mealtimes more successful as a way to bond as a family?

Don't worry so much about the quality of the food as the quality of the mood.

Meal time is not the time to correct. It's the time to connect.

4. LIFE CAN BE STRESSFUL AND THERE IS SO MUCH PULLING ON US NOWADAYS. DO YOU HAVE ANY TIPS FOR PREPARING FOR FAMILY TIME SO YOU ARE IN A GOOD FRAME OF MIND?

Unplug—turn off your phones and computers and TVs and music.

Take a moment to center yourself. Breathe and think about something wonderful.

5. WHAT ABOUT TIME ISSUES? EVERYONE'S SO BUSY. HOW DO YOU MAKE ALL THIS FAMILY TIME FIT?

Combine family night and family scripture time with things you are already doing, like family meals and prayers. If you haven't been doing these things, consider taking small steps toward your larger goal. So, instead of expecting yourself to go from doing nothing to doing it all overnight, make a goal to have one FHE this month and read one scripture each week together. Then increase your goals as you see success until FHE and scripture study are part of your regular routine.

6. WITH SO MANY FREE IDEAS AVAILABLE ONLINE, WHY WOULD ANYONE WANT TO BUY A BOOK?

If you have 20 minutes to spend with your family, do want to spend it looking for an idea that will work for your kids' ages and interests and one that you have all the materials to do? Or do you want to pick up a book, have all the ideas organized, and actually spend time with your family?

Despite your crazy busy life, you can have wonderful family time on a regular basis, teach your children important life lessons, and have fun with your family.

Church History

When did family home evening as a church program start? In 1915, Joseph F. Smith

inaugurated family home evening in an official letter from the First Presidency. (For a short video on the inauguration of family home evening, see https://goo.gl/oXGvNF.)

President David O. McKay reemphasized the family home evening program, and a family home evening manual was published to support families each year from 1970–1985.

On September 23, 1995, "The Family: A Proclamation to the World," a declaration from the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve Apostles, was published. President Gordon B. Hinckley read the proclamation in the Women's Session of General Conference in October 1995. (See Gordon B. FHEASY SAMPLE LESSON IDEAS

FAITH IN GOD

"Read 'The Family: A Proclamation to the World'. Make a list of things you can do to help strengthen your family and make a happy home. Share the list with your parents or Primary leader" (13).

ACTIVITY

Get a stack of wooden pencils (or thin, breakable sticks). Show your family the pencils. Pick one up and break it. Show how it isn't strong by itself. Then pick up as many pencils as you have people in your family and try to break the bunch. Show that together your family is stronger. Then look at fun family pictures together and reminisce. Talk about what you like about your family. Talk about what makes you strong and what could make you stronger.

ACTIVITY

Have everyone write down their favorite things about each person in the family. Talk about different things your family has done together that you've enjoyed. Make sure to talk about day-to-day things as well as occasional activities you've done. Look at family pictures together.



SUNDAY

"See that ye love one another; cease to be covetous; learn to impart one to another as the gospel requires. Cease to be idle; cease to be unclean; cease to find fault one with another.
